Since questions of sexual abuse emerged in the Church, and in other institutions, in the 1980s, some dioceses (including Chicago) have demonstrated leadership in dealing with the issue. After the "Spotlight" investigation by the *Boston Globe*, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops established a "zero tolerance" policy toward the commission and cover-up of abuse. This panel of Catholic scholars and professionals will review the Church's attempt to face this issue and will consider why it has reemerged in 2018, relating that question to broader issues of clericalism and governance in the Catholic Church.

KIM DANIELS is the associate director of the Initiative on Catholic Social Thought and Public Life at Georgetown University. A graduate of Princeton University and the University of Chicago Law School, Kim was appointed by Pope Francis as a Member of the Vatican Dicastery for Communication in 2016, and has been a lead advisor to the U.S. bishops and Catholic organizations on issues where Church teachings intersect with public life.

RUSSELL HITTINGER is the William K. Warren Professor of Catholic Studies and Research Professor of Law at the University of Tulsa. He is also a member of the Pontifical Academy of the Social Sciences and the Pontifical Academy of St. Thomas Aquinas. Hittinger is the author of many books, including the forthcoming *Paper Wars: Catholic Social Doctrine and the Modern State*.

FR. MICHAEL SWEENEY, OP, founded and directs the Lay Mission Project of the Western Dominican Province. Previously he served as President of the Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology (DSPT) in Berkeley, California. Fr. Sweeney gives lectures and workshops around the country on lay formation and the mission of the Church.
