

Celebrated University of Chicago President Robert Maynard Hutchins once remarked that the Catholic Church has "the longest intellectual tradition of any institution in the contemporary world." The mission of the Lumen Christi Institute is to make that tradition a vital part of the secular university.

The Lumen Christi Institute continues to enrich academic communities at the University of Chicago and beyond with the insights of Catholic thought, in order to engage our secular culture in dialogue and ultimately to renew our civilization by forming leaders for a global society in need of Christian wisdom.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Dear friends of the Lumen Christi Institute,

In 1852, St. John Henry Newman delivered a series of lectures, which grew into his classic text, *The Idea of a University*. In those lectures, Newman defines a university as "a place of teaching universal knowledge." To achieve this ambitious mission, Newman argues that the university needs the Church:

Practically speaking, it cannot fulfill its object duly, such as I have described it, without the Church's assistance; or to use the theological term, the Church is necessary for its integrity. Not that its main characters are changed by this incorporation: it still has the office of intellectual education; but the Church steadies it in the performance of that office.

Newman made his argument decades before the establishment of the University of Chicago (1890) and many of America's major research universities (e.g., Johns Hopkins, 1876; Stanford, 1885; Caltech, 1891). His point, nevertheless, holds true for every university: "the Church is necessary for its integrity."

My own experience as a student at the University of Chicago played out as Newman suggested a university education should. As an eighteen-yearold, I enrolled in the University of Chicago's storied core curriculum and read Genesis, Homer's *Iliad*, Plato's *Republic*, and others with my peers. It was—until that point—the most challenging academic experience of my life. At the same time, I began to meet fellow Catholics, and they were unlike any Catholics I had ever known: they were the kind of people that I suspect would have been Newman's friends. They loved God, and they loved the life of the mind.

Now, twenty years later, it is a joy to see University of Chicago students reading great texts together through the hospitality of a Catholic institute. In 2022-23, my first year as Lumen Christi's director, we hosted 24 student reading-group sessions (and 141 events in total). This past year, our student reading groups tripled: we held 75 sessions (and 187 events altogether). As a whole, our students read a great deal: the Latin Vulgate Bible, James Joyce's Dubliners, the short stories of Flannery O'Connor, Wendell Berry's World-Ending Fire, the complete works of Dionysius the Areopagite, Jose Ortega y Gasset's Revolt of the Masses, and others. In many cases, they read Catholic authors, and in others no. And in Newman's spirit, the Church was "assisting" in every case.

A Culture of Friendship

The 2023-2024 academic year was characterized by the deepening of personal engagement with students at the University of Chicago and across Chicagoland. Major lectures and headlining events were paired with a curated selection of targeted reading groups, master classes, and a brand new Nicklin Fellowship for undergraduates, which fosters an intellectual community that nourishes and challenges students throughout their university career.







LCI's national network continues to grow, while local programming continues to focus on a deeper engagement with students through community and intellectual formation.

Growing a National Footprint: The In Lumine Network

In 2022, LCI won a \$3.65 million grant to build a community of institutes for Catholic thought at secular universities across the nation: the *In Lumine Network*. LCI and its sister institutes have now hosted online events, campus lectures across the country, and summer seminars focused on the symbiotic relationship and fruitful tensions between science and religion. Four *In Lumine Network* summer seminars have brought nearly sixty students to Duke University, the University of Pennsylvania, the University of Southern California, and Cornell University for personalized conversations with first-rate scholars.




